Competitiveness Council

The creation of the Competitiveness Council in June 2002, through the merging of three previous configurations (Internal Market, Industry and Research) was a response to the perceived need for a more coherent and better coordinated handling of these matters related to the European Union's competitiveness. Depending on the items on the agenda, this Council is composed of European Affairs Ministers, Industry Ministers, Research Ministers, etc. It meets about five or six times a year.



1 EU Insight

The importance of international cooperation in research and innovation – Conclusions of the Council of the European Union

On 29 and 30th of May, 2013, the European "Competitiveness Council" (covering the areas "Internal Market, Industry, Research and Space") adopted a series of conclusions endorsing a new EU strategy for enhancing international cooperation in research and innovation which was laid down in the European Commission's Communication "Enhancing and Focusing EU International Cooperation in Research and Innovation: a Strategic Approach". This EU International Strategy for Research and Innovation was published on the 14th of September 2012, taking stock of the current state of the EU's international cooperation in research and innovation and developing a new approach, particularly paying attention to the implementation of international cooperation within the next framework programme "Horizon 2020" (2014-2020).

The September 2012 Commission's Communication

Addressing the <u>European Parliament</u>, the <u>Council of the European Union</u>, the <u>European Economic and Social Committee</u> and the <u>Committee of the Regions</u>, the European Commission identified three key objectives of the broader policies of the EU which are supported by international cooperation in research and innovation:

- "Strengthening the Union's excellence and attractiveness in research and innovation as well as its economic and industrial competitiveness
- Tackling global societal challenges
- Supporting the Union's external policies"

The Commission aims at "maximising the impact of international research and innovation activities, while avoiding a costly fragmentation of efforts", which "requires the Union to complement the openness of Horizon 2020 with targeted actions in order to ensure optimal scale and scope." The strategic approach foresees as a first step the identification of areas for international cooperation along a set of criteria laid down in the document; based on these criteria the strategic approach will start out by "developing multi-annual roadmaps for cooperation with key partner countries and regions". The following country groupings are included in the Horizon 2020 proposals:

- The EFTA countries, EU enlargement countries and countries covered by the European Neighbourhood policy
- Industrialised countries and emerging economies
- Developing countries.



The May 2013 European Council Conclusions

About half a year later, the Competitiveness Council adopted Conclusions endorsing this September 2012 communication and enhancing the importance of the international dimension of the European Research Area (ERA). The Council acknowledges "the important progress towards improved international cooperation made through FP7 projects, including through the INCO Programme, and also by opening participation to third countries and contributing to the development of international cooperation flagship projects". The Council also "stresses the importance of ensuring that Horizon 2020 facilitates cooperation among researchers from across the globe on addressing shared challenges, while giving due attention to reciprocity and respect for intellectual property rights".

Furthermore, the Conclusions particularly recognize and stress "the important advisory work of the <u>Strategic Forum for International S&T Cooperation (SFIC)</u>, its contribution to mutual learning and its role in promoting coordination of international cooperation priorities of Member States, for instance, as regards the India initiative and the building up of the Indo-European Research and Innovation Partnership". Therefore, the Council "encourages SFIC to continue its advisory work with its initiatives such as with India, China, the USA, Brazil and others".

The conclusions acknowledge the importance of international cooperation and strongly support the new strategic approach advocated by the Commission.

SFIC is a strategic forum and an advisory body to the Council and the Commission with a view to implementing a European Partnership in the field of international scientific and technological cooperation (S&T cooperation). SFIC's objective is to facilitate the further development, implementation and monitoring of the international dimension of ERA by the sharing of information and consultation between the partners with a view to identifying common priorities which could lead to coordinated or joint initiatives, and coordinating activities and positions vis-à-vis third countries and within international fora.







2.1 EURAXESS participates in the 65th Annual Meeting of the SBPC – Recife, 21 - 26 July

EURAXESS Links Brazil will be present at the 65th annual meeting of the Brazilian Society for the Progress of Science (SBPC), which will be held from 21 to 26 July 2013 at the Federal University of Pernambuco (UFPE) in Recife, Pernambuco. This 2013 edition will be dedicated to "Science for the new Brazil".

EURAXESS will have its own stand at the parallel science, technology and innovation exhibit, ExpoT&C. EURAXESS Links Brazil country representatives will provide information to all researchers and visitors interested in the European research landscape and in conducting research in Europe or with European partners. 2.2 EURAXESS Science Slam Brazil 2013 – Rio de Janeiro, September 2013

EURAXESS Links Brazil is organizing a Science Slam to take place in Rio de Janeiro in September. The event will also take place in the other countries and regions of our worldwide network: ASEAN, China, India, Japan and North America.

For its first edition, the event will give young researchers based in Brazil the chance to showcase their work as well as their oral talent and creativity in front of members of the research and business community and the wide public, in a joyful and convivial atmosphere. The event will be open to all fields of research.

The winner will be invited to participate in the "EURAXESS <u>Voice of the Researchers</u>' Conference", which will be held in Brussels on 21-22 November 2013.

To join the EURAXESS Science Slam Brazil 2013 as a presenter, the candidates will have to submit a 3-minutes video of themselves introducing the performance they would hold at the EURAXESS Science Slam 2013 event. 2.3 EURAXESS Links on Brazilian radios

2.4 Presentation to Institute for Studies Brazil-Europe (IBE)

EURAXESS Links Brazil gave a presentation to the management committee of the Institute for Studies Brazil-Europe (IBE), which is a EU funded project aimed at fostering higher education and research cooperation between Brazil and Europe. This meeting was held on the 6th of June at the premises of the São Paulo University, which is the coordinator of the IBE consortium, composed of 16 of the most important Brazilian universities and 14 European universities.

The IBE representatives expressed a significant interest in the opportunities offered by EURAXESS and in having EURAXESS presentations at their universities.

EURAXESS Links Brazil is also invited to actively participate in the third annual congress of the IBE entitled "Innovation, culture and sustainability: challenges for Brazil and Europe", which will take place from 9 to 11 October in Florianopolis.

2.5 Joint Road show on mobility and Science without Borders

EURAXESS Links Brazil took part in a Joint Road Show on Mobility with representatives from academic exchange agencies and universities of Austria, Australia, Germany and Holland. They presented mobility opportunities to students and researchers in UFSCar (São Carlos), UNICAMP (Campinas), and UFMG (Belo Horizonte) between the 4th and the 6th of June 2013.

3 News & Developments

3.1 EURAXESS Links network

3.1.1 EURAXESS Links now on Linked-In

3.1.2 EURAXESS Links expands to Canada

EURAXESS Links North America officially opened up to researchers based in Canada during the "Hydrogen + Fuel Cells 2013 Conference", held from June 16th to June 19th in Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada.

3.1.3 EURAXESS Connect Event on Urban Innovation organized in China

The <u>EU-China Joint Workshop on Urban Innovation co-organized by EURAXESS Links China</u> was successfully held on 30-31 May 2013 in Foshan. Fruitful discussions took place in the three thematic areas addressed in parallel sessions: sustainable development and urban planning, green urban mobility and energy solutions for cities.

In line with its overall mission to valorise European researchers outside of Europe as an asset for Europe, EURAXESS Links China funded the participation of five China-based European experts balanced between industry, academia and governmental bodies.

3.1.4 First EURAXESS Links North America Share event

On June 4th, EURAXESS Links North America held its first event "EURAXESS Share: Research Job and Funding Opportunities in Europe for All" in Omaha, Nebraska.

James Gavigan, Minister Counsellor for Research & Innovation at the EU Delegation to the USA presented the broad political context of EU-US scientific cooperation. The audience was also provided with extensive information on EURAXESS and funding and collaboration opportunities in Europe, with a focus on the EU Marie-Curie actions and ERC grants.

3.2 EU and Member States

3.2.1 Intense negotiations on EU budget for Horizon 2020 have concluded with a deal

After months of discussions an informal agreement was reached on the 25th of June on the EU's next seven year funding programme for science and research. The so-called Horizon 2020 package will have a budget of €70.2bn for projects over the next seven years. As Parliament's Industry, Research and Energy Committee chair Amalia Sartori stated: "We now have a deal on Horizon 2020, a world-class research and innovation programme to drive economic recovery and job creation. Parliament's negotiating team ensured that SMEs will be fully included in the innovation process."


The package still needs to be endorsed by the COREPER (Committee of Permanent Representives of EU member states in Brussels). The indicative budget proposed by the Commission is subject to final agreement on the Multi-Financial Framework (MFF).

Following "long and challenging" negotiations, EU officials have agreed the percentages of three key "pillars" within the Horizon 2020 programme.

 'Excellent Science', which includes funding for the European Research Centre, infrastructure and future and emerging technologies, receives 37%.







- 'Industrial Leadership', containing specific support for SMEs and for key enabling industrial technologies, receives 22.5%.
- 'Societal challenges', designed to point research towards growing problems associated with an ageing society and environmental blight receives 38%.

A separate instrument within the Horizon programme will recognise the role of SMEs and pledge that 20% of Horizon 2020 will be directed towards these smaller companies.

A new simplified funding model will rationalise funding applications across the whole programme, cutting back on red tape and increasing the pool of potential applicants for funding.

3.2.2 European Commission dedicates 77 million Euros to SME innovation

The European Commission (EC) has decided on the 13th of June to dedicate 77 million Euros to help SME innovation. The initiative, called **I4MS** (Innovation for Manufacturing SMEs), will stand as a pilot project for Horizon 2020 and is expected to encourage SMEs to integrate efficient ICTs in their production process as to increase their potential. It is also meant to support them in the launching of innovation projects.

According to the Commission's Vice President Neelie Kroes, the idea behind the EC's move is to "translate research leadership into productivity gains and increased competitiveness of the EU's products and industrial actors.". It also follows a recent EC agenda shift that set the investment in new technologies and innovation as "the top priority in its Industrial Policy strategy." The projects will start in July and will benefit over 200 European SMEs and back up around 150 innovative projects.

The European Commission reiterates the vital role of **Pan European networks such as EUREKA** and its clusters in the running of the programme, as they provide knowledge and support for partnering beyond national borders.

SMEs are encouraged to send their application for funding as soon as the **Call for Experiments** is opened by these centres.

3.2.3 EU rewards 9 innovative public initiatives in Europe

On 6 June, the European Commission announced the winners of the European Prize for Innovation in Public Administration. This prize celebrates the **most innovative, forward-looking public initiatives which benefit citizens, firms, or the education and research sector.** Nine initiatives from Croatia, Finland, the Netherlands, Portugal, Slovakia, Spain (two winners), Sweden and the UK were awarded EUR 100 000 each. Winning initiatives included integrated healthcare information accessible on a phone, a web-based platform for funding opportunities for firms, and a nationwide plagiarism detection system for higher education institutions.

3.2.4 ICT 2013 - Conference programme announced

The ICT 2013 conference will be held in Vilnius on 6-8 November 2013. The event will focus on Horizon 2020 - the EU's Framework Programme for Research and Innovation for 2014-2020. It will feature top ICT professionals from industry, academia & research. Speakers from across the ICT sector will address a range of issues from cloud computing, broadband, ICT infrastructures, ICT skills, cyber security, long term visions on the future and much more. Experts will present details on how to participate in Horizon 2020.

3.2.5 3rd European Energy Conference (E2C 2013)

The **3rd European Energy Conference (E2C 2013)** will take place in Budapest, Hungary, from 27 to 30 October 2013. It will cover chemistry, physics and material sciences related to energy technologies. To harness safely and efficiently the energy of the Sun both directly and indirectly, as well as the nuclear and thermonuclear power generation are in the centre of the conference programme. Energy storage in chemical and other forms, hydrogen infrastructure and energy transfer by photosynthesis will also be discussed. The aim of the conference is to lead to effective and fruitful communication between the research, government and industrial communities for a more sustainable and efficient European energy policy.

3.3 Brazil

3.3.1 Brazil studies facilitating the admission of foreign skilled workers

The Brazilian federal government may open more the job market to foreign professionals. The measure, according to the economist of the Secretariat of Strategic Affairs (SAE) Marcelo Cerri, will be a strategy to increase the supply of skilled labour.


Cerri has presented a study on immigration in one of the debates of the project 'Research Network: Training and Work', in Brasilia. "It is scary how much a company has to do to bring a foreigner to Brazil," said Cerri.

One of the aspects developed by the study is producing a diagnosis of the immigration issue in the country. Opinion surveys are also being conducted on the experience of Brazilian companies that have hired foreigners.

According to Cerri, Brazil can only benefit from incoming skilled foreign professionals. "They can not be treated as a threat. We do not want to replace the Brazilian labour force", he added.

The research aims to support public policies that will favour the granting of visas for skilled workers.

3.3.2 Brazil dominates the 2013 QS World University Rankings: Latin America

Brazil has retained its position as Latin America's leading centre of higher education in the latest QS rankings for the region.

Brazil appears at two of the top three universities in the ranking and 11 of the top 30. Universidade de São Paulo (USP) remains narrowly ahead of Chile's Pontificia Universidad Católica at the head of the ranking, with Universidade Estadual de Campinas (Unicamp) in third place.

3.3.3 Latin American and Caribbean countries committed to promote competitiveness and inclusion

Fourteen countries in Latin America and the Caribbean have determined to promote industrial policies and investments to create new productive capacities, boost strategic industries and increase competitiveness, bringing forth an environmentally sustainable and inclusive technological paradigm based on scientific knowledge and innovation.

The group approved a cooperation platform, transcribed in the Declaration of Rio de Janeiro, which aims to further planning processes generated in several of the countries involved, in order to strengthen regional policies for science, technology and innovation (S, T & I). This set of commitments results from the meeting of ministers of the Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC), which ended on the 18th of June.

The preparatory event for scholars awarded with sandwich undergraduate scholarships for the second semester of this year by the Science Without Borders Program was held on the 11th of June in the auditorium of the National Council for Scientific and Technological Development (CNPq).

With the presence of consulate representatives of countries to which the students will embark to in the coming months, the new scholars were able to discuss the most frequently asked questions and learn the key information about culture, education, climate, among others.

3.3.5 Brasília receives final preparatory meeting for World

Science Forum

The preliminary program of the 7th Preparatory Meeting for the World Science Forum has been released. Brasilia will host the event on the 10th and 11th of July. The theme will be "Science for Environment and Social Justice".

Debates and lectures will be promoted in the two days. The first such lecture will be about the challenges of science for the new urban social reality. The

3.3.6 Brasília will host the World Congress on Information Technology in 2016

In 2016 Brasilia will host the World Congress on Information Technology (WCIT). The governor of the Federal District (DF), Agnelo Queiroz, and the Association of Brazilian Companies for Information Technology (Assespro) signed a cooperation agreement during an official ceremony at the governor's Palace on the 17th of June.

3.3.7 Mercosur approves creation of Virtual School Foundation

The Mercosur bloc approved the creation of the Mercosur Virtual School Foundation, a non-profit organization, headquartered in Uruguay and composed of associations of public and private institutions of the bloc.

The foundation will give legal form to the Virtual School of Mercosur, which is an integrating platform for a network of institutions aimed at training professionals to consolidate the information society and development of the digital economy.

This school provides bilingual training, courses, workshops, lectures, forums, a library and media library, events and communities of practice, in addition to providing access to online course management, development and adaptation of content; comprehensive management of professional communities of practice; availability platform and technical support for generating content, presentations, informational activities or working groups.

The School results from the Mercosur Digital project, an initiative of international cooperation between the European Union and the South American bloc.

3.4 Cooperation EU, Member States, Brazil

3.4.1 UK and Brazil science institutions strengthen partnership

The British Biotechnology and Biological Sciences Research Council (BBSRC) and the Brazilian National Council for Scientific and Technological Development (CNPq) signed, on 11 June, a Letter of Understanding to implement a new Cooperation Programme to extend the long-term collaboration between the parties. Steve Visscher, Deputy Chief Executive, signed for the BBSRC while CNPq was represented by its President, Glaucius Oliva.

Activities under the Cooperation Programme will include launching calls for research partnership proposals, providing funding for the proposals selected,



organising joint workshops related to common projects and other forms of scientific and technological cooperation.

The signed Letter will add new impetus to a long-standing collaboration between scientists from both countries. The UK-Brazil Year of Science & Innovation in 2007, the joint Brazil-UK Agrosciences workshop in 2008 and the establishment of an Embrapa Laboratory Exterior (LabEx) in the UK are just a few important milestones of this relationship.

At the same time, FAPESP and the British Council signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) to foster research cooperation between scientists in the UK and in the State of Sao Paulo, Brazil, through the funding of collaborative research activities under the guidelines of the British Council's Researcher Links programme. 3.4.2 Inmetro signs cooperation agreement with the German Metrology Institute

The National Institute of Metrology, Quality and Technology (INMETRO) signed an agreement on scientific and technological cooperation with the German metrology institute Physikalisch-Technische Bundesanstalt (PTB) on the 12th of June. The objective is to create a basis for cooperation, especially in the fields of scientific and industrial metrology, chemical metrology; legal metrology, and other advanced areas of this field.

Joint research work on the development and implementation of new methods is also envisaged, as well as the use of tools to facilitate cooperation on conformity assessment procedures. The main areas to be studied are: health, safety and environment.

4.2 EU Member states and associated countries

4.2.1 FRANCE-BRAZIL - Doctoral grants for Brazilian wishing to carry out research in collaboration with industry in France

Last February, the CNPq signed a 4 years agreement with the French Ministry for Higher Education and Research and the ANRT (Association Nationale de la Recherche Technique) to fund CIFRE grants. The agreement is part of the Science without Borders programme and aims at funding 30 CIFRE-Brazil grants per year and at least 10 in 2013.

CIFRE grants enable doctoral candidates to conduct their PhD research within an industrial enterprise, in cooperation with an external academic research team. The enterprise and the student enter into a three-year work contract, under which the enterprise pays the student a monthly net stipend.

Students wishing to obtain a CIFRE grant must apply, with their Doctoral Department, to the national association for technical research (http://www.anrt.asso.fr; section CIFRE BRÉSIL).

4.2.2 FRANCE-BRAZIL - GUYAMAZON 2013 Call for Projects

The Inter-establishment Agency for Research and Development (AIRD), the France Embassy in Brazil, the Region of Guyana and, the CIRAD, and the Brazilian State level research agencies (FAPs) of Amazonas (FAPEAM), Amapá (FAPEAP) and Maranhão (FAPEMA), launched a call for proposals aimed at supporting projects based on a scientific collaboration between researchers (and/or teachers-researchers) of higher education and research institutions located in France, preferably in Guyana, and institutions located in one or several Brazilian states of Amazonas, Amapá and Maranhão.

4.2.8 NETHERLAND – BRAZIL: open call in bio-economy

The CNPq and the Organization for Scientific Research of the Netherlands (NWO) launched on the 24th of June, a new public joint call in the context of international cooperation between the two institutions. Tenders to be submitted in the area of bio-economy should involve Brazilian and Dutch.

This call will be awarded scholarships modalities PhD Sandwich Abroad (SWE) and Postdoctoral Abroad (PDE), with maximum duration of 12 months each.

4.2.9 PORTUGAL-BRAZIL - Public call funds joint projects
