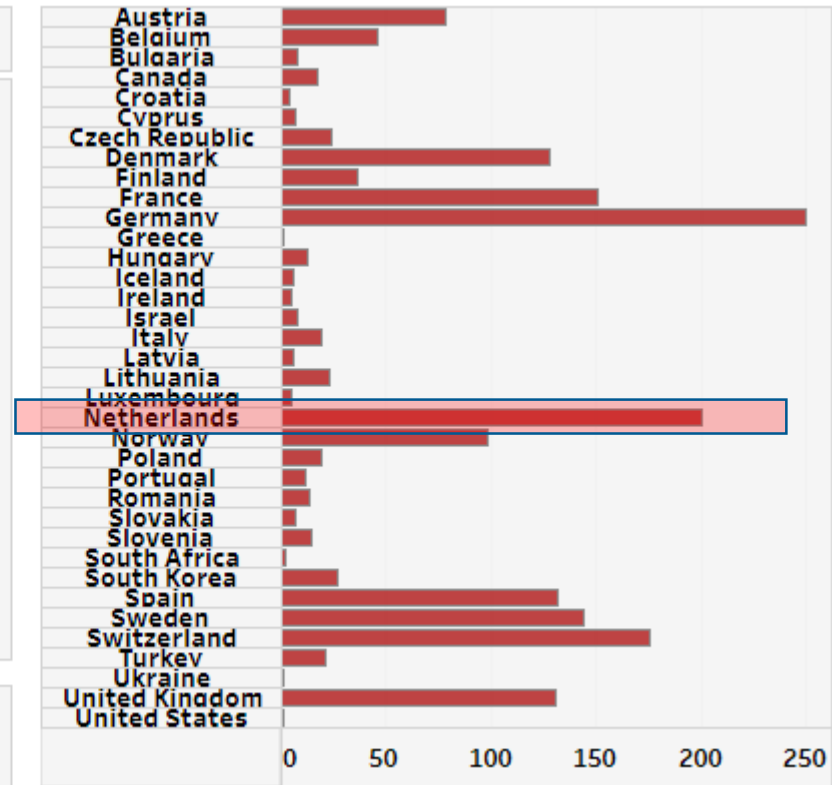
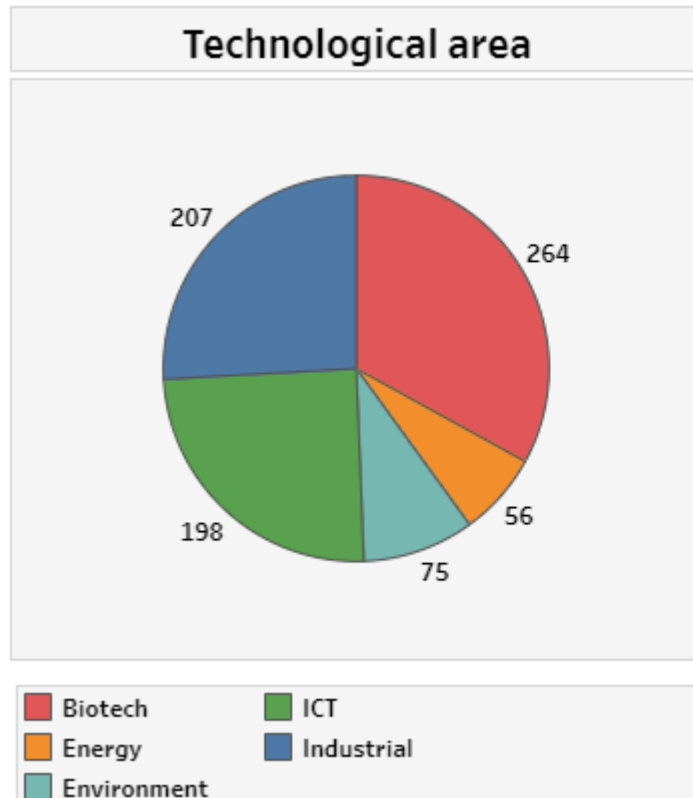

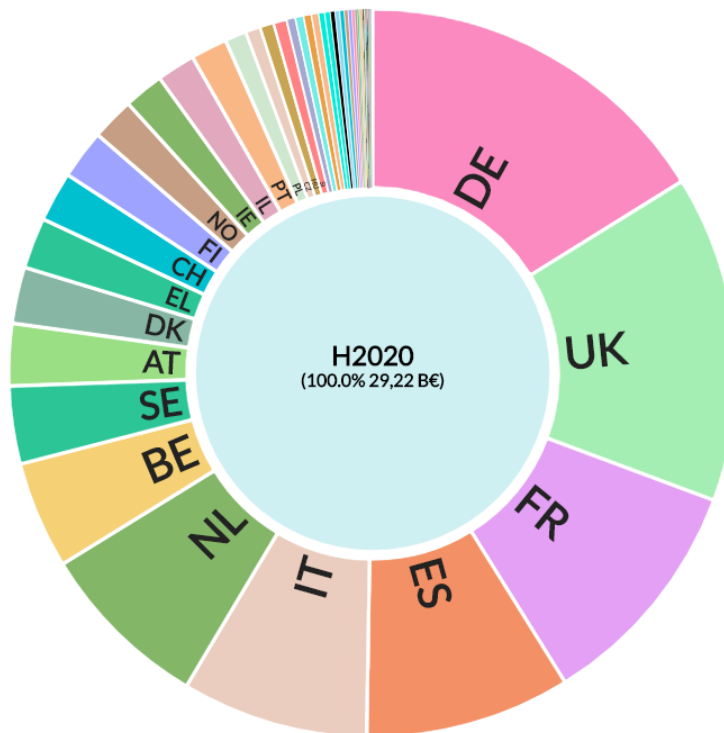


# Eurostars-2: number of projects





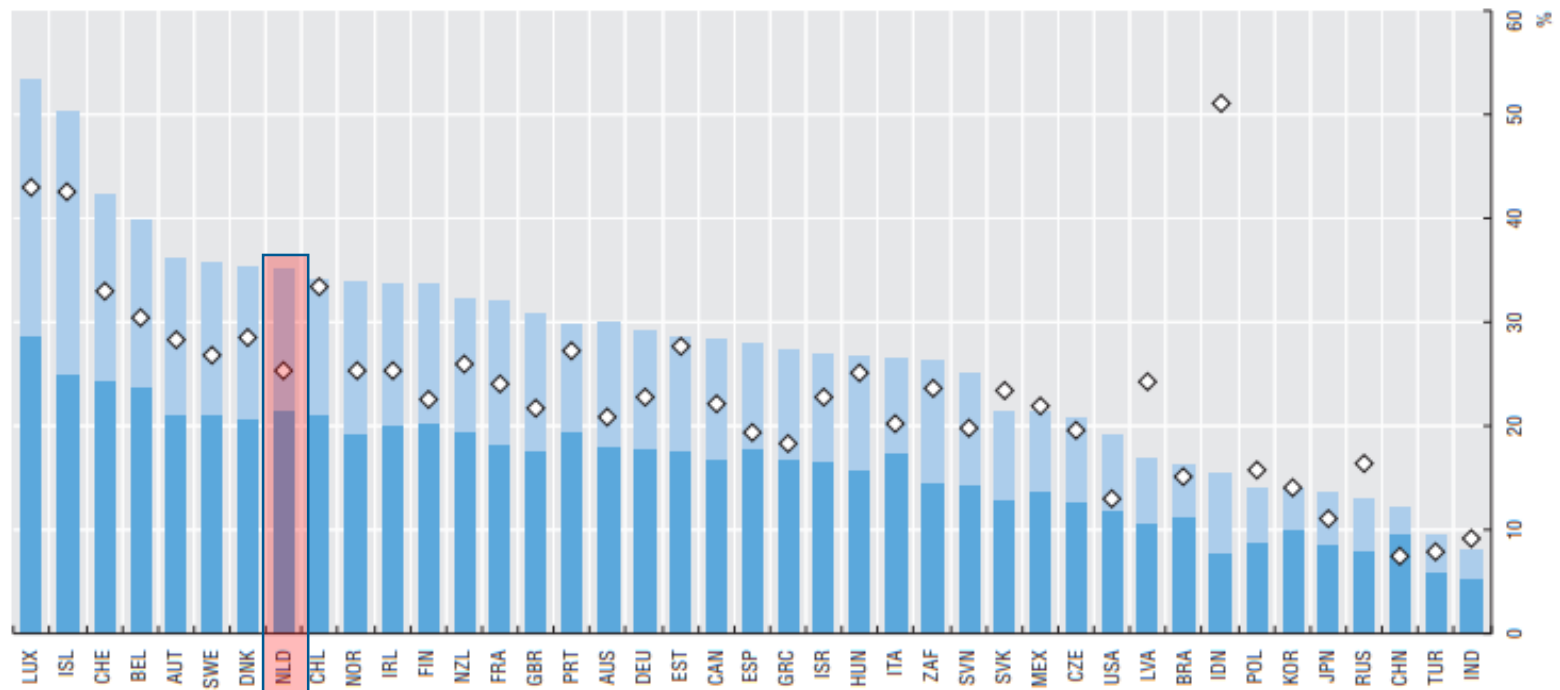
# H2020 participation

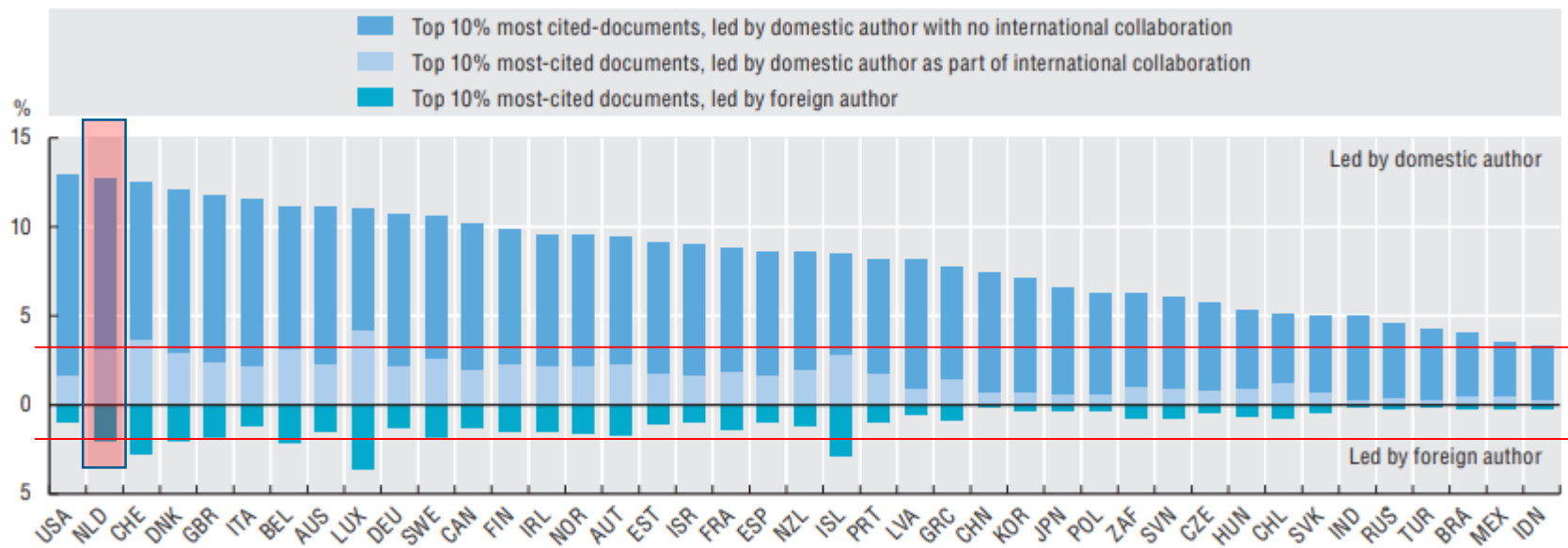
# International scientific collaboration, 2015
